# Requirements for the importation of fertilizers into Guyana

Listed below are the procedures that must be followed when importing commercial quantities of fertilizer for resale/distribution.

# 1. <u>Registration of the applicant (renewable annually)</u>

All importers of fertilizers must be registered with the National Plant Protection Organisation. Applicants are required to complete the following forms:

- a. Commercial Importer Registration Form
- b. Application for imported fertilizer product registration
- c. Application for a license to operate as fertilizer handlers
- d. Application for fertilizer warehouse registration certificate

Additionally, applicant is required to provide a form of identification (passport or national ID), Taxpayer Identification Number (TIN) certificate and business registration.

#### 2. Application for Import license

Applications forms for import license are downloaded from the Ministry of Tourism, Industry & Commerce website (www.business.gov.gy) or purchased at the Guyana Stores Ltd; these forms are to be filled in triplicate. The filled applications must be brought to the National Plant Protection Organisation for **endorsement**.

For endorsement, the applicants are to provide copies of:

- a. Certificate of Origin
- b. Certificate of Quality and Quantity
- c. Certificate of Analysis
- d. Label
- e. Invoice
- f. Proof of Payment at the Pesticide & Toxic Chemical Control Board (PTCCB) for Granular Fertilizer.

# NB: Once the above listed conditions are met, a no objection stamp is issued by the NPPO.
